N a y P y i T a w , 8 July—Chairman of Central Committee for Implementation of Peace and Stability and Development in Rakhine State, Vice-President Dr Sai Mauk Kham accompanied by Union Ministers Lt-Gen Ko Ko and U Aye Myint, State Chief Minister U Hla Maung Tin, the Western Command commander, the deputy ministers, diplomats and departmental officials left Sittway by Tatmadaw Helicopter and arrived in Myebon Township this morning.

Then, the Vice-President and party inspected eight-room quarters for 44 households and clinics in Kantha Htwetwa relief camp in Myebon and greeted family members and staff. Next, Union Ministers Lt-Gen Ko Ko and U Aye Myint provided them with rice and instant noodle packets.

Afterwards, the Vice- President and party visited Taungpaw relief camp housing 3844 people of 715 households and met the in-charge of the camp. The Vice-President coordinated matters related to health, education and socioeconomic conditions.

After inspecting the clinic, temporary primary school and water tanks in the camp, the Vice-President met the victims and the Union ministers presented relief items to them. Similarly, the diplomatic corps led by the Indonesian ambassador to Myanmar visited the relief camps where they met the victims and asked what they wanted to know.

In the afternoon, the Vice-President and party proceeded to Kyainnipyin relief camp in Pauktaw Township and met with the victims. The Vice-President asked health, education, socioeconomy and necessities of the region and attended to the need. Kyainnipyin relief camp accommodates the victims who do not accept to take shelter at the temporary housing built by the government.

The Indonesia ambassador, the Bangladeshi ambassador and the UNHCR in-charge asked health, education and other necessities and clarified ongoing assistance programmes.

The Vice-President then arrived at Setyonsu relief camp accommodating 1172 people of 220 households Danyawady (Ka) Ward in Sittway and inspected the clinic, traditional medicine clinic and ten-room quarters. The Vice-President met family members of the camp and fulfilled the requirements.

T h e I n d o n e s i a ambassador to Myanmar also met the national races family members and raised questions and gave encouragements to them. Union Ministers Lt-Gen Ko Ko and U Aye Myint presented gifts to officials concerned.

In the evening, Vice-President Dr Sai Mauk Kham and party arrived back in Nay Pyi Taw by special flight of Myanma Airways via Sittway.
